Draft Mines and Quarries (Tips) Regulations 1971

THE Secretary of State for Trade and Industry, in accordance with the provisions of Section 142 and Part I of the Second Schedule to the Mines and Quarries Act 1954, hereby gives notice that he proposes to make General Regulations under sections 141 and 143 of the Mines and Quarries Act 1954 and sections 1 and 4 to 8 of the Mines and Quarries (Tips) Act 1969 entitled the Mines and Quarries (Tips) Regulations 1971.

The draft regulations which apply both to heaps of solid refuse and to settling ponds set out certain general requirements for all existing and new tips to which Part I of the 1969 Act applies; they cover such matters as responsibility for drainage supervision, maintenance and inspection. Tips which because of their size, nature or location are more likely to prove a potential hazard are described in the draft regulations as "classified" tips, and made subject to more onerous requirements covering each phase, from the planning stage until tipping ceases. The regulations revoke the Mines and Quarries (Notification of Tipping Operations) Regulations 1969 but incorporate their substance.

CORPORATION OF DUNDEE

CLEAN AIR ACT, 1956

The Dundee (Fintry) Smoke Control Area
Order, 1971

1. NOTICE is hereby given that the Corporation of the City of Dundee in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the First day of July 1971 made an Order entitled "The Dun-

dee (Fintry) Smoke Control Area Order, 1971" declaring the area described in the schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area. This Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for Scotland for Confirmation and if confirmed, will come into operation on the 1st day of October 1972.

2. Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of Section 11(4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable, to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels are: anthracite and semi-anthracite, briquetted fuels carbonised in the process of manufacture, coke electricity, gas, low temperature carbonisation fuels, low volatile steam coals, fluidised char binderless briquettes and "Multiheat" briquettes manufactured by the National Coal Board, "Rexco Briquettes" manufactured by Scottish Rexco Limited and "XL Briquettes" manufactured by Taylor Brothers (Dundee) Limited.

3. Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the office of the Town Clerk, City Chambers, Dundee, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 16th day of July 1971.

(Restriction of Waiting) Order 1971
