

Queen Street.

South Side from a point 275 feet eastwards from Gray Street to a point 100 feet westwards from St. Vincent Street.

• NOTES.

1. The proposed waiting restrictions will not apply on Sundays.
2. Waiting will be permitted for any of the following purposes:—
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from a vehicle;
 - (b) building operations or operations relating to the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair of sewers or main pipes or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telegraphic line;
 - (c) Police, Fire Brigade, Ambulance and certain other statutory purposes;
 - (d) collection or delivery of postal packets (by Post Office vehicles);
 - (e) funerals (if vehicle is in the service of a funeral undertaking);
 - (f) licensed taxi-cabs at appointed stances;
 - (g) delivering goods to or collecting goods from premises adjoining the said roads subject to a maximum waiting period of 30 minutes at any one place;
 - (h) the removal of furniture.
3. Provision will be made for the granting of exemptions from the waiting restrictions to severely disabled drivers.

(Prohibition of Entry) Order 1971

1. THE Corporation of Greenock propose to make two Orders under Sections 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.
2. The effect of the above named Orders will be as follows, viz:—
 - (a) By the Roxburgh Street/Ann Street Order, vehicular traffic on Ann Street will be prohibited from entering that part of Roxburgh Street east of Ann Street (which will become a "No-through" road from its junction with Trafalgar Street) and *vice versa*.
 - (b) By the Roxburgh Street/Wellington Street Order, vehicular traffic on Wellington Street or coming out of the lower part of Ann Street will be prohibited from entering the upper part of Ann Street (which will become a "No-through" road from its junction with Dempster Street) and *vice versa*.
3. Full details of the proposals are in the draft Orders which, together with plans showing the restricted roads and a statement of the Corporation's reasons for proposing to make the Orders, may be examined at the Town Clerk's Office, Municipal Buildings, Greenock, between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Mondays to Fridays (inclusive).
