THE BURGH OF HAMILTON
(‘BUS STOPS) (CLEARWAY) ORDER 1971

1. HAMILTON Town Council propose to make an Order under Sections 1(1), (2), (3), (3B) and (6) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

2. When this Order comes into effect vehicles must not be left between the hours of 7 a.m. and 11 p.m. all days of the week on the specified roads listed in the Schedule attached hereto.

3. Exceptions will permit waiting in connection with:—

(a) any building operations;

(b) maintenance of roads;

(c) supply of gas, electricity and water;

(f) a vehicle waiting in any case where the person in control of the vehicle:—

(i) is required by law to stop;

(ii) is obliged to do so in order to avoid an accident; or

(iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control and it is not reasonably practicable for him to drive or move the vehicle to a place not within the said prohibited area.

4. Full details of these proposals are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the restricted lengths of road and a statement of the Council’s reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined at the offices of the Town Clerk and Manager, The Town House, Cadzow Street, Hamilton, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.
