STOPPING UP OF HIGHWAYS IN THE BURGH OF KILSYTH

THE Secretary of State for Scotland hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an order under section 46 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1947, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order 1955, as extended by section 89 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1969 and as amended by section 96 of that Act, authorising the stopping up of a length of Newtown Street and the whole of Westport Street, Kilsyth.
