ORDER 1971

1. ON 21st September 1971, the Town Council of Denny and Dunipace made the above-named Order under Sections 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Road Transport Act 1948.

- Picking up or setting down passengers.
- Loading or unloading goods.
- Carrying out essential services connected with the maintenance of the road and the supply of gas, water and electricity.
- Disabled drivers.
- Registered medical practitioners while on duty.

4. In other parts of certain of the roads specified above waiting will be permitted for twenty minutes in any period of one hour.

5. A copy of the Order and a map showing the roads affected are available at the Town Clerk's Office, Town House, Glasgow Road, Denny, where they may be examined between 8.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

6.
