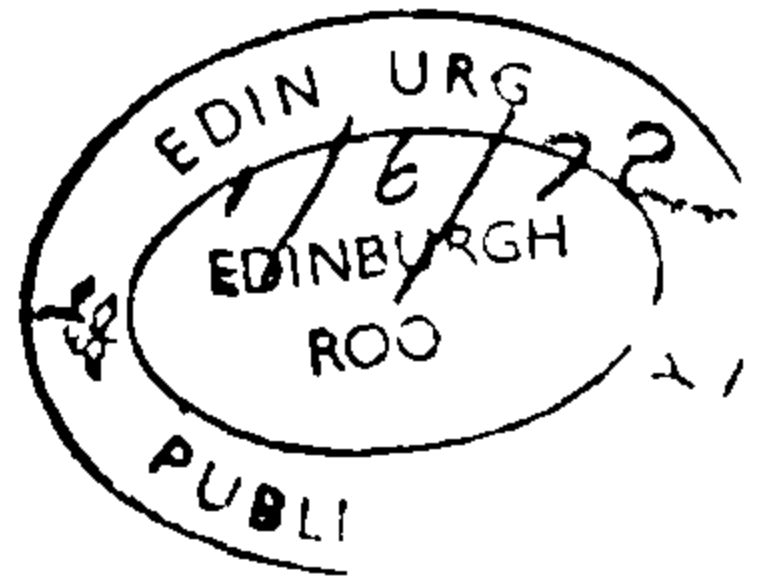

WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1959

Lace Finishing Wages Council (Great Britain)

THE Lace Finishing Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Secretary of State for Employment proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Lace Finishing) Order 1970 (Order L.(32)); (2) amending the provisions relating to holidays and holiday remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Lace Finishing) (Holidays) Order 1970 (Order L.(33)); and (3) the revocation of Order L.(32) and Order L.(33).

THE PERFORMING RIGHT TRIBUNAL

SCHEDULE A

Developments or Operations

1. The carrying out of certain development within the curtilage of a dwelling-house specified in Part I, Column (1), Class I of the First Schedule to the Town and Country Planning (General Development) (Scotland) Order 1950, namely, (1) the enlargement, improvement or other alteration of a dwelling-house so long as the cubic content of the original dwelling-house (as ascertained by external measurement) is not exceeded by more than 1750 cubic feet or one-tenth whichever is the greater, subject to a maximum of 4000 cubic feet; provided that the erection of a garage, stable loosebox or coach-house within the curtilage of the dwelling-house and required for any purpose incidental to the enjoyment of the dwelling-house as such shall be treated as the enlargement of the dwelling-house in this context; and (2) the erection, construction or placing and the maintenance improvement or other alteration, within the curtilage of a dwelling-house, of any building, or enclosure (other than a dwelling, garage, stable, loosebox or coach-house) required for a purpose incidental to the enjoyment of the dwelling-house as such, including the keeping of poultry, bees, pet animals, birds or other livestock for the domestic needs or personal enjoyment of the occupants of the dwelling-house.

2. The carrying out of certain sundry minor operations specified in Part I, Column (1), Class II of the said First Schedule, namely, (1) the erection or construction of gates, fences, walls or other means of enclosure not exceeding 4 feet in height where abutting on a road used by vehicular traffic or 7 feet in height in any other case, and the maintenance, improvement or other alteration of any gates, fences, walls or other means of enclosure; and (2) the painting or colouring of the exterior of any building or work otherwise than for the purposes of advertisement, announcement or direction.

Waiting and Loading Restrictions (Aikenhead Road) Order 1972

THE Corporation of the City of Glasgow have made the above Order under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended.

The Order will come into operation on 19th June 1972 and its effects will be:

1. to introduce restrictions on waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and between the hours of 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturdays and a ban on loading and unloading at the morning and evening peak periods in Aikenhead Road from 140 feet east of the east kerb line of Cathcart Road eastwards for 280 feet, and
2. to ban waiting, loading and unloading at the morning and evening peak periods in the portion of Aikenhead Road extending from 420 feet east of the east kerb line of Cathcart Road south eastwards and southwards to the south kerb line of Allison Street.

(Prohibition of Through Traffic) (Birkhall Avenue, etc.) Order 1972

3. Waiting by vehicles will be restricted between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and between the hours of 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturdays and there will be a peak period ban on loading and unloading
 - (a) on both sides of Gallowgate between Abercromby Street and Wyper Place
 - (b) on both sides of London Road between Bridgeton Cross and Nuneaton Street.
4. Waiting, loading and unloading by all vehicles (other than buses) will be prohibited between the hours of 6 a.m. and 12 midnight daily in London Road at the closed off entrances to Montgomery Street and Kirkpatrick Street.
5. "Box Junction" restrictions will be introduced
 - (a) at the junction of Fraser Street, Boden Street and London Road
 - (b) at the junction of Brook Street, Heron Street and London Road.
6. The use of the portions of Gallowgate and London Road at the closed off entrances to certain side streets for the waiting, loading or unloading of vehicles will be regulated.
