A PROCLAMATION

DETERMINING THE DESIGN FOR THE FIFTY NEW PENCE COINS COMMEMORATING THE
ACCESSION OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND TO
THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES

ELIZABETH R.

Whereas under Section 3 (b) of the Coinage Act 1971 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to determine the design of coins to be made at Our Mint:

And Whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine a new design, hereinafter specified, for the fifty new pence coin (being the coin specified in Our Proclamation of the twentieth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight) to be struck at Our Mint to commemorate the accession of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland to the European Communities on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-three:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said section 3 (b) and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in Our said Proclamation of the twentieth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight, the design for the fifty new pence coin to be struck at Our Mint in commemoration of the accession of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland to the European Communities shall be as follows:—

For the obverse impression Our Effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH II D.G. REG. F.D.", and for the reverse the inscription "50 PENCE" and the date of the year, surrounded by nine hands, symbolising the nine members of the Community, clasping one another in a mutual gesture of trust, assistance and friendship. The coin shall have a plain edge.

2. This Proclamation shall come into force on the twenty-ninth day of December One thousand nine hundred and seventy-two.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twentieth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventy-two, and in the twenty-first year of Our Reign.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 29th December 1972, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £120,000,000.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one new half-penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payments in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Minister of Posts and Telecommunications hereby gives

licences as amended from time to time of the abovementioned
type granted by him on and before the 1st day of January
1973 shall be read, construed and take effect as if Paragraphs
1(1)(b), 1(2)(b) and 6, the Schedule and the Footnotes thereto
were replaced by the following Paragraphs, Schedule and
Footnotes, and the following additional Paragraph 15(1)(a)(iv)
applied:—

to use the Station for the purpose of (i) sending
to and receiving from other licensed amateur
television stations with which communication
is separately and singly established, as part of
the self-training of the Licensee in communi-
cation by wireless telegraphy, visual images for
the purpose of the investigations in wireless
telegraphy of the Licensee or the person with
whom he is in communication; (ii) sending by
radiotelephony to licensed amateur stations
messages relating solely to technical matters
connected with the sending and receiving of
the said visual images; (iii) sending of sinu-
soidal tones for the purpose of testing the
apparatus comprised in the Station; (iv) send-
ing the call sign of the Station by radiotele-
phony; (v) receiving messages from other
licensed Amateur stations and (vi) receiving
transmissions in the Standard Frequency Ser-
vice.

1(2)(b)

The Station shall be operated only (i) by the
Licensee personally, or (ii) in the presence of
and under the direct supervision of the Lic-
ensee, by any other person who holds a current
wireless telegraphy license issued by the Min-
ister to use another amateur station or who
holds an Amateur Radio Certificate issued by
the Minister.

- (1) An indelible record shall be kept in a book
(not loose-leaf) (in this Licence called "the
Log") showing the following:—
- (a) Date.
 - (b) Time of commencement and termin-
ation of each period of sending
(including the tests referred to in
clause 4(2) hereof).
 - (c) Call signs of the stations with which
communication is established, times of
establishing and ending communica-
tion with each station, and the fre-
quency (not frequency band) or fre-
quencies (not frequency bands) and
class or classes of emission and power
used in each case.
 - (d) Visual image source.
 - (e) The address of the alternative premises
when the Station is established under
the provisions of Clause 1(1)(a)(ii)
hereof.

All times shall be in G.M.T. No gaps
shall be left between entries and all entries
shall be made at the time of sending and
receiving.

- (2) If the station is at any time operated by a
person other than the Licensee (see clause
1(2)(b)(ii) hereof) the Licensee shall ensure
that the Log is signed by that person with
his full name, and that the call sign of the
station which he is licensed to use, or, (if
there is no such station) the number of his
Amateur Radio Certificate is shown in the
Log.

15(1)(a)(iv)

"Standard Frequency Service" shall have the
same meaning as in the Radio Regulations and
Additional Radio Regulations in force under
the International Telecommunication Conven-
tion signed at Montreux on the 12th day of
November 1965, where it is defined as "A
radiocommunication service for scientific, tech-
nical and other purposes, providing the trans-
mission of specified frequencies of stated high
precision, intended for general reception".
