## NEW TOWNS (SCOTLAND) ACT 1968

NOTICE is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Scotland in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 1 of the New Town (Scotland) Act 1968 (hereinafter called the "Act") made on the 19th day of March 1973 an order entitled the New Town (Cumbernauld) Designation Amendment Order 1973 designating as additional to the area of Cumbernauld New Town areas of land extending to 3,638 acres or thereby in the parishes of Cumbernauld, Kirkintilloch and New Monkland in the County of Dunbarton and shown within the inner edge of the broken black line on the map signed and sealed with reference thereto.

The said areas of 3,638 acres lie within the 3,880 acres shown on the map referred to in the draft New Town (Cumbernauld) Designation Amendment Order 1971 copies of which together with copies of the map were deposited for inspection at the places mentioned below on the 11th day of June 1971 and with respect to objections to which a Public Local Inquiry was held in the Church Hall of St. Mungo's Parish Church, Cumbernauld on the 7th, 8th, 11th and 12th September 1972:—

The order becomes operative on the date on which this notice is first published, subject to appeal to the Court of Session within six weeks from that date in accordance with paragraph 6 of Schedule 1 to the Act.

## CLEAN AIR ACTS 1956 and 1968

## THE BURGH OF DUMBARTON

## SMOKE CONTROL AREA ORDER No. 11 1973

1. NOTICE is hereby given that the Town Council of Dunbarton in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956 on the 28th day of March 1973, made an Order entitled "The Burgh of Dunbarton Smoke Control Area Order No. 11, 1973" declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation.

2. Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of Section 11(4) of the Act if on any day after the Order has come into operation smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £50 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels are anthracite and semi-anthracite, briquetted fuels carbonised in the process of manufacture, coke, electricity, gas, low temperature carbonisation fuels, low volatile steam coals, fluidised char binderless briquettes manufactured by the National Coal Board, "Multiheat" briquettes, "Rexco" briquettes, "XL" briquettes and "Durafyre" ovoids.

3. The Order will not come into operation until at least six months after it is confirmed by the Secretary of State and in any event not before 1st April 1974.

4. Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Office, Municipal Buildings, Dunbarton, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 13th day of April 1973.

5. Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by Notice in writing to the Secretary, Scottish Development Department, 21 Hill Street, Edinburgh, EH2 3JY, object to the confirmation of the Order.
