BURGH OF BISHOPBRIGGS

*The Burgh of Bishopbriggs (Lomond Drive) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1973*

THE Town Council of the Burgh of Bishopbriggs propose to make the above Order under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended. The effect of the Order would be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time as under:

(a) On the north side of Lomond Drive from its junction with Balmuildy Road to a point 108 metres eastwards.

Exceptions will permit waiting for the purposes of:

- (a) Picking up and setting down passengers.
- (b) The maintenance of roads.
- (c) The supply of gas, electricity and water, and by
- (d) Disabled drivers.

3. The Order will come into operation on the First day of September, Nineteen Hundred and Seventy-four or on such later date as is not earlier than six months from the date of the confirmation of the Order by the Secretary of State for Scotland.
