### RUBBER PROOFED GARMENT MAKING INDUSTRY WAGES COUNCIL

THE Rubber Proofed Garment Making Industry Wages Council hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Secretary of State for Employment proposals for varying the provisions relating to statutory minimum remuneration for certain female workers as set out in the Wages Regulation (Rubber Proofed Garment) Order 1974 (Order R.P.G.(38)). Particulars of the proposals, which have been approved by the Pay Board, are contained in the Wages Council's Notice R.P.G.(40) which may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals if made to it within 14 days from 9th April 1974. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections and quote the number of the Wages Council's Notice of Proposals R.P.G.(40).

## ROADS (SCOTLAND) ACT 1970

### THE LONDON-EDINBURGH-THURSO TRUNK ROAD A.9

### PITLOCHRY BYPASS

THE Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders in connection with a diversion of the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road A.9 at Pitlochry in the County of Perth and Kinross.

1. An Order under Sections 1(2) and 2(3) of the Trunk Roads Act 1946 that the lengths of road on construction shall become trunk roads and Perth and Kinross Joint County Council shall become the Highway Authority for the roads superseded which shall cease to be trunk roads.
2. An Order under Section 14(1) of the Special Roads Act 1949 to provide for (a) the construction of new roads (b) the improvement of existing roads and (c) the stopping up of existing roads.

3. An Order under Section 14(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1970 to provide for the stopping up of private means of access to premises from the new trunk road.

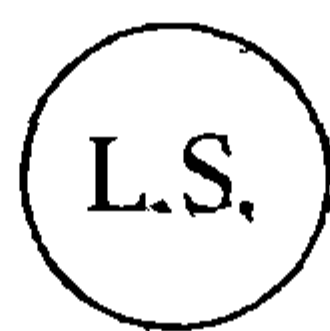
