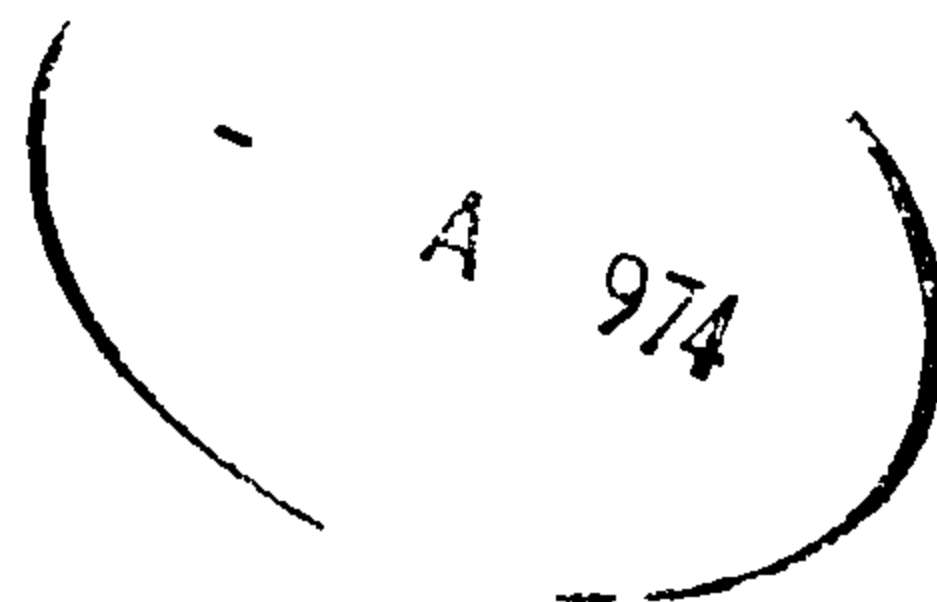
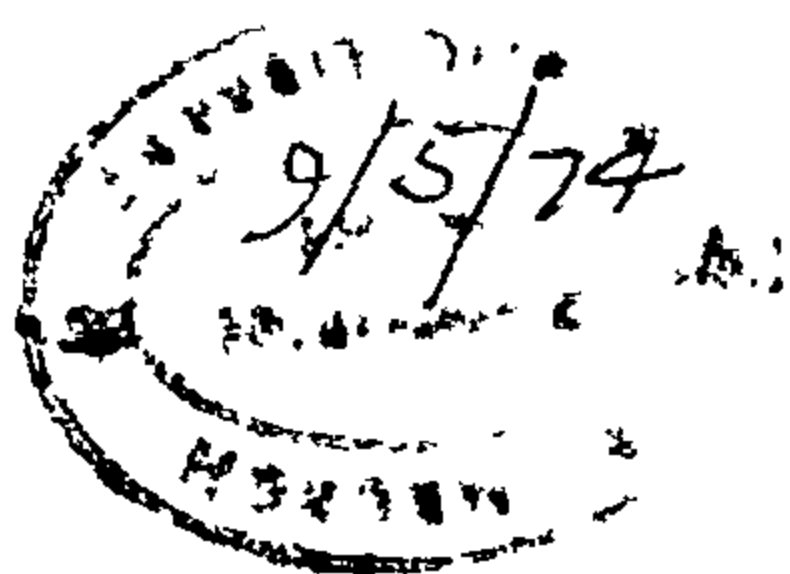

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

THE Secretaries of State for the Environment, for Scotland
and for Wales hereby give notice that they intend to make an

per hour (Temporary Speed Limit) Order 1973 and prohibiting

December 1973 were subject to a speed limit of 60 miles
per hour originally imposed by the Orders mentioned in

The provisions of the proposed Order will not affect existing
speed limits of 50 m.p.h. or less having effect by virtue of
Sections 71 to 74 of the Act.

WEIGHT RESTRICTION ORDER 1974

1. ON 30th April 1974, the Town Council of the Burgh of Cumbernauld made the above named order under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

2. When this order comes into effect, subject to the exceptions set out below, no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle the weight of which exceeds Three tons laden weight on the length of the Arns Road specified in the Schedule to this order. - (d) in the course of military training operations.
