

MISUSE OF DRUGS ACT 1971

*Suspension of Direction Prohibiting Exercise of Powers
in relation to Controlled Drugs*

IN accordance with section 12(4) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State gave the following direction which was served and thereby came into effect on 27th June 1974:

Whereas on 7th June 1973 a direction under section 12(2) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 was given in respect of JOHN ADAMS MACDOUGALL, B.M., Ch.B., D.P.H., a doctor, whose registered address is 34 Liberton Brae, Edinburgh 9, prohibiting him from having in his possession, prescribing, administering, manufacturing, compounding and supplying and from authorising the administration and supply of the substances and products for the time being specified in paragraphs 1 to 5 of Part I of Schedule 2 to that Act:

And whereas the said direction of 7th June 1973 took effect on 1st July 1973:

And whereas under section 12(3) of the said Act of 1971 the Secretary of State may at any time give a direction suspending a direction given by him under subsection (2) of that section:

Now therefore, in exercise of the power conferred on me by the said section 12(3) I, the Right Honourable Roy Jenkins, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this direction suspend the said direction of 7th June 1973 insofar, and only insofar, as it was given in respect of the said John Adams Macdougall.

THE TRUNK ROADS (INVERURIE)
(RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 1974

THE TRUNK ROADS (BRORA)
(RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 1974

THE Secretary of State proposes to make an order prohibiting waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive on that length of the Inverness-Thurso Trunk Road (Route A.9) at Brora from a point 40 yards west of the junction with Gower Street to a point 40 yards north of the junction with Park Terrace.

THE TRUNK ROADS (MUSSELBURGH)
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING)
AMENDMENT ORDER 1974

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make an order amending the Trunk Roads (Musselburgh) (Prohibition of Waiting and Loading) Order 1971 to impose a prohibition on waiting and loading in the vicinity of the three pedestrian crossings. In addition waiting would be restricted on Linkfield Road south-west of its junction with Mill Hill, in the vicinity of the bus stop.

SOUTH AFRICA: OFFICIAL CERTIFICATE

THE Secretary of State for Scotland in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food (Scotland) Regulations 1968 as amended by the Imported Food (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1973 hereby restricts recognition of the Official Certificates reproduced in the Schedule to the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* dated 16th January 1962 for the importation of meat and meat products from South Africa, to the extent shown in the Schedule hereto.

The Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* dated 29th May 1973 is hereby revoked.

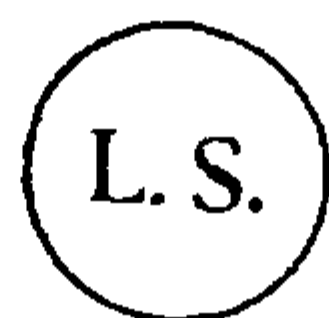
