HILLINGTON SECOND INTERCHANGE

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make an order for the construction of a traffic roundabout at Hillington, at the junction of Glasgow Road A.8, Renfrew Road A.8 and Hillington Road A.754 at the boundary between the City of Glasgow District and Renfrew District.
