WHEREAS the Secretary of State has, in pursuance of the powers competent to him under section 5 of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act 1855, made a Representation that he has received a copy of an Interlocutor dated the 6th day of September 1976, pronounced by the Sheriff of the Sheriffdom of North Strathclyde at Greenock finding that continued use of the Burial Ground known as the Old Burial Ground (formerly known as the Old Church Yard), Inverkip, in the District of Inverclyde as a place of interment of cremated human remains would be offensive or contrary to decency:

And Whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that in terms of section 5 of the aforesaid Act interment of cremated human remains be discontinued forthwith in the said Burial Ground:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to give Notice of the said Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration on the 21st day of January next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order, or notice thereof, be published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* and that copies of this Order or notice thereof, be fixed as required by the said Act on the doors of the Church of, or on some other conspicuous place within, the parish affected by such Representation one month before such Representation is so considered.

Now know ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorised and appointed, and do by these Presents authorise and appoint you the said Baron Hughes (Chairman); Peter Maxwell; Donald Buchanan Robertson; William Brown; James Reid Clark; Ethel May Houston; Laurence Colvin Hunter; Donald McGregor; Joan Macintosh; Geoffrey Mackintosh Shaw; and Alexander Stewart Weatherhead, to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry;

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any six or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; to call for information in writing; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever;

And We do by these Presents authorise and empower you, or any of you, to visit and inspect personally such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid;

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any six or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any six or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do;

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any six or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration;

Anw We Will and Command the said Letters Patent to be extended in the most ample form and to pass the Seal aforesaid *per saltum* without passing any other Seal or Register. For doing whereof these Presents shall be a sufficient Warrant to the Keeper of the Registers of Scotland for writing the said Commission in the Chancery Office in Edinburgh and to the Keeper of the said Seal for causing the same to be appended thereto.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

THE FUEL CONTROL
(MODIFICATION OF ENACTMENTS)
(SPEED LIMITS) ORDER 1973

THE Secretaries of State for Transport, for Scotland and for Wales hereby give notice that they have made under Section 77 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as extended by the above-mentioned Order, The 60 miles per hour and 50 miles per hour (Temporary Speed Limit) Order 1976 continuing the general speed limits which were imposed on roads (other than motorways) by The 60 miles per hour and 50 miles per hour (Temporary Speed Limit) Orders 1974 and 1975.

The 60 miles per hour and 50 miles per hour (Temporary Speed Limit) Order 1976 prohibits for a period of 6 months

commencing at midnight on 30th November 1976 the driving of motor vehicles:—

- (1) at a speed exceeding 60 miles per hour on any dual carriageway road; and
- (2) at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on any road which is not a dual carriageway road.

The provisions of the above Order do not affect existing speed limits lower than those in (1) and (2) above imposed by virtue of Sections 71 to 74 of the Act, nor do they apply to motorways.

Notice of Seizure under the Customs and Excise Act 1952

PURSUANT to Section 275(5) of the Customs and Excise Act 1952 and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely 399 "Vantage" cigarettes have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that being goods chargeable with a duty of Customs they were allowed to be delivered without payment of that duty on condition that they would not be sold or disposed of except to an entitled person, and the aforesaid condition was not observed.
