Barochan Road (Route B789) Houston

- A. From a point 10 metres south-east of the entrance of Houston Cemetery south-eastwards for a distance of 208 metres or thereby.
- B. From a point 155 metres south-east of Whorlie Road south-eastwards for a distance of 32 metres.

Hallcraig Road, Houston

From the east kerblin of the realigned Barochan Road north-eastwards and thence northwards for a distance of 335 metres with a reservation of a means of passage for pedestrians.

WEIGHT RESTRICTION

ON 14th January 1977, the Regional Council made the above-named Order under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 14 to the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

This Order, which comes into operation on 26th January 1977 prohibits vehicles of 5 tons on Bowhousebrae Road (C71), Gartness extending from its junction with Craighens Road westwards to Glenview, Gartness.

AMENDMENT ORDER

ON 14th January 1977 the Regional Council made the above-named Order under Section 1(1), (2), (3) and 84D(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, and Section 133 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1968.

This Order, which comes into operation on 31st January 1977 amends all sections of Russell Colt Street to two-way operations except the section lying 100 metres east of the junction with Gartsherrie Road, which will remain one-way from east to west.

*West Blackhall Street, Greenock**One-Way and Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting*

ON 18th January 1977 the Regional Council made the above-named Order under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Section 133 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973.

This Order, which comes into operation on 24th January 1977 introduces One-Way Traffic in parts of Laird Street, West Blackhall Street, Nicolson Street and Westburn Street and various waiting restrictions with the usual exemptions in the said streets. The Pedestrianisation Scheme is to be revoked.
