

Court of Session, Scotland

IN a Petition presented to the Court of Session, Scotland on 10th February 1976 by TARRADALE CONSTRUCTION COMPANY LIMITED, a Company incorporated under the Companies Acts and having its registered office at 22 High Street, Dingwall, for an Order to be wound up by the Court, the following interlocutor was pronounced:—

“19th January 1977. Lord Allanbridge for Lord Kincaig.—Act: *M’ler*.—The Lord Ordinary, having considered the Note No 24 of process and proceedings, dispenses with the settlement of a list of contributories; sanctions the appointment of Messrs. Brodies, W.S., Edinburgh as solicitors to assist the Noter in the performance of his duties; appoints all creditors of the Company to lodge their claims and grounds of debt with the Noter on or before 28th February 1977, failing which they shall be excluded from the benefit of any distribution made before their debts are proved, and appoints the Noter to discharge this order once in each of the *Edinburgh Gazette* and *Press and Journal* newspapers; finds the Noter entitled to the expenses of and incidental to the Note and directs said expenses to be expenses in the liquidation.”
