And Whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that in terms of section 5 of the said Act interment of cremated human remains be discontinued forthwith in the said Burial Ground: And Whereas by an Order in Council of the 15th day of November 1976 Notice of such Representation was given and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 21st day of January 1977, and that the said Order, or notice thereof, should be published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* and that copies of the said Order or notice should be fixed on the doors of the Church of, or on some other conspicuous place within, the parish affected by such Representation, one month before the said 21st day of January 1977:

And Whereas Notice of the said Representation and of the time when it pleased Her Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council has been duly published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* and fixed in manner required by the said Order in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and His Royal Highness The Prince Charles, Prince of Wales, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, and by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, do on Her Majesty's behalf order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. That in terms of section 5 of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act 1855 interment of cremated human remains be discontinued forthwith in the Burial Ground known as the Old Burial Ground (formerly known as the Old Church Yard), Inverkip, in the District of Inverclyde.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Scotland) (Old Burial Ground, Inverkip, Inverciyde) Order 1977.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Regulations further amend the Social Security (Cate-gorisation of Earners) Regulations 1975 ("the principal regulations ").

They make provision for persons employed to give instruction (other than occasional instruction) in an educational establishment to be treated as employed earners, and for the secondary contributor in respect of such employment. They also provide for persons employed as examiners for any examinations leading to an academic qualification to be treated as self-employed earners where the whole of the work is to be performed in less than twelve months.

The Regulations also amend the principal regulations by prescribing a secondary contributor in respect of employments of a person by his or her spouse. They also revoke the pro-visions of the principal regulations relating to persons employed as public opinion or market research interviewers.

The other amendments are of a consequential nature.
