THE ROADS (SCOTLAND) ACT 1970
THE ACQUISITION OF LAND
(AUTHORISATION PROCEDURE) (SCOTLAND)
ACT 1947

NOTICE is hereby given that the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the above-mentioned Acts on the 21st day of February 1977 made a Compulsory Purchase Order entitled the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (Henderson's Bridge, Ayton) Compulsory Purchase Order 1977.

The order provides for the purchase of the lands described in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of constructing a new length of trunk road on the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (A1) at Ayton in the District of Berwickshire.

Copies of the order and of the map referred to therein have been deposited at the offices of the Scottish Development Department, New St. Andrew's House, St. James Centre, Edinburgh; the Regional Headquarters of the Borders Region, Newtown St. Boswells; the office of the Berwickshire District Council, 8 Newton Street, Duns; and at the Post Office, 35 High Street, Ayton, and may be seen there without payment of fee during office hours.

The order as made becomes operative on the 8th day of March 1977 but if application is made to the Court of Session under paragraph 15 of the First Schedule to the Acquisition of Land (Authorisation Procedure) (Scotland) Act 1947, as extended by section 60 of the Land Compensation (Scotland) Act 1973, within a period of six weeks from that date by any person aggrieved by the order who desires to question the validity thereof the Court of Session may, by interim order, suspend the operation of this order, or any provision contained therein, either generally or in so far as it affects any property of the applicant, and may, if satisfied that the authorisation granted by the order is not empowered to be granted or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirement of the said schedule or any regulation made thereunder not having been complied with, quash the order or any provision contained therein either generally or in so far as it affects any property of the applicant.

The Secretary of State may acquire the land to which this notice relates by a general vesting declaration under section 278 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972. The effect of the making of such a declaration is to vest the land in the Secretary of State at the end of the appropriate period and is explained fully in Part (1) of Schedule 2 to the Compulsory Purchase of Land (General Vesting Declaration) (Scotland) Regulations 1969 (S.I. 1969 No. 1570). A print of the said Regulations has also been deposited and may be seen as aforesaid.

Every person entitled to claim compensation in respect of any of the land or any interest in the land is invited to give information with respect to his name and address and the land and interest in question, to the Secretary, Scottish Development Department, New St. Andrew's House, St. James Centre, Edinburgh.

In this Schedule:—

- (1) All the land specified is situated in the Parish of Ayton and for registration purposes in the County of Berwick.
- (2) References to the "A1" are to the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (A1).

Number on Map	Description of Land
1	Land on the south side of the A1 between the west side of the road to Flemington and a point about 300 metres west thereof.
3, 4, 7, 9, 10	Land on the north side of the A1 extending from a point about 300 metres west of the junction of the A1 and the road to Flemington extending eastwards to the junction of the A1 and the road at Fairmieside passing under the railway line to the north-east of Henderson's bridge.
