## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

#### POST OFFICE SCHEME T1/1977

NOTE: The Scheme which follows this Note has been made under Section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and will come into operation on the 16th May 1977. It amends the Post Office Telecommunication Scheme 1976 (Post Office Scheme T1/1976) as amended by the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1976 (Post Office Scheme T2/1976).

The principal change is the introduction of charges for new items of equipment and apparatus.

(This Note is not part of the Scheme).

#### THE POST OFFICE TELECOMMUNICATION AMENDMENT (No. 2) SCHEME 1977

Made ... .. 25th April 1977  
 Coming into operation 16th May 1977

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by Section 28 of the Post Office Act 1968, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

##### *Commencement and citation*

1. This Scheme shall come into operation on the 16th May 1977 and may be cited as the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1977.

##### *Interpretation*

2.—(1) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Telecommunication Scheme 1976 (Post Office Scheme T1/1976) (hereinafter called "the principal Scheme") as amended by the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1976 (Post Office Scheme T2/1976).

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

##### *Removals, alterations and substitution of equipment or apparatus*

3. In paragraph 27 of the principal Scheme there shall be inserted the following additional sub-paragraph:

"(5) The charge payable under sub-paragraph (3) in a case where an item of equipment or apparatus is substituted for another shall be payable in addition to any single payment in respect of the provision of that item which the Post Office may require the subscriber to make in accordance with paragraph 30".

##### *Single payment charge*

4. For paragraph 30 of the principal Scheme there shall be substituted the following paragraph:

##### *"Single payment charge*

30.—(1) If the Post Office so requires, the subscriber shall make a single payment in respect of the provision of any equipment or apparatus in addition to any rental, connection, or other charge payable in respect thereof.

(2) The amount of the single payment shall be:

- (a) For any item listed in Schedule 17, the appropriate charge shown in that Schedule;
- (b) For any other item, such amount as the Post Office may fix".
