THE FORT WILLIAM-MALLAIG TRUNK ROAD
(A830)-KINSADEL-KINLOID DIVERSION

NOTICE is hereby given that the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the above-mentioned Acts, on the Twenty-fifth day of July 1977 made a compulsory purchase order entitled the Perth-Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road (Kingsway No. 1) Compulsory Purchase Order 1977.

The order provides for the purchase of the land described in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of improving a section of the A972 trunk road from its junction with Liff Road to Clepington Road, Dundee.

A copy of the order as made and of the map referred to therein have been deposited at the offices of the Scottish Development Department, New St. Andrew's House, St. James Centre, Edinburgh and Tayside Regional Council, Tayside House, 28 Crichton Street, Dundee and may be seen there without payment of fee during business hours.

The order as made becomes operative on the First day of August 1977 being the date on which this notice is first published; but a person aggrieved by the order may in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 15 of Schedule 1 to the Acquisition of Land (Authorisation Procedure) (Scotland) Act 1947 as extended by section 60 of the Land Compensation (Scotland) Act 1973 by application to the Court of Session within 6 weeks from that date, question its validity on the grounds (i) that the authorisation granted by the order is not empowered to be granted or (ii) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by failure to comply with any statutory requirement relating to the order.

The Secretary of State may acquire the land and the rights in land to which this Notice relates by making a General Vesting Declaration under Section 278 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972. Such a declaration shall not be executed before the end of the period of two months beginning with the date of the first publication of this notice except with the consent of every occupier of the land affected. The effect of the making of such a Declaration is to vest the land and the rights in land in the Secretary of State at the end of the appropriate period and is more fully explained in Form 9 contained in The Compulsory Purchase of Land (Scotland) Regulations 1976, (SI 1976 No. 820). A copy of the said Regulations has also been deposited and may be seen as aforesaid.

TAKE Notice that the Perth-Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road (Kingsway No. 1) Compulsory Purchase Order 1977 which has been made by the Secretary of State for Scotland, authorising him to purchase compulsorily for the purpose of the improvement of the Perth-Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road (A972), at Kingsway West, Dundee includes the lands described in the Schedule hereto.
