**HIGHLAND REGIONAL COUNCIL
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1967
(AS AMENDED)**

**THE HIGHLAND REGIONAL COUNCIL,
INVERGORDON (VARIOUS STREETS) PROHIBITION
AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND BANK STREET
AND KING STREET (ONE WAY) ORDER, 1977**

1. THE Highland Regional Council propose to make an Order under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968.

2. When this Order comes into effect the following provisions will apply:

(a) the waiting of vehicles is prohibited or restricted as specified in the Order in the following roads or part thereof—High Street, Castle Road, King Street, Bank Street all in the Burgh of Invergordon.

Exceptions will permit waiting for the purposes of:

1. Picking up and setting down passengers.
2. Loading and unloading goods.
