

In terms of paragraph 1 of Schedule 1 to the Act the following is a statement of the general effect of the proposals for access to fishings:—

Of about 568 miles of inland waters in the River Tweed catchment area access to about 426 miles is being offered at reasonable charges to the general public for trout fishing, including most of the best freshwater fisheries. The proposals thus cover over 75% of all the fishing waters in the area.
