(FALKIRK ROAD, GRANGEMOUTH A.904)
(SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 1979

THE Central Regional Council propose to make an Order under Section 74(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, which, in effect, will impose a Speed Limit of 40 m.p.h. on the section of Falkirk Road, Grangemouth described in the Schedule hereto.
