NOTICE is hereby given that the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the above-mentioned Acts, on the 6th day of February 1979 made a Compulsory Purchase Order entitled the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (Ayton Bypass) Compulsory Purchase Order 1979.

The Order provides for the purchase of the land described in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of constructing a new length of the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (A1) to bypass the village of Ayton in the Borders Region.

A copy of the Order as made and of the map referred to therein have been deposited at the offices of the Scottish Development Department, New St. Andrew's House, Edinburgh; the Borders Regional Council, Regional Headquarters, Newtown St. Boswells and at the Post Office, 35 High Street, Ayton and may be seen there without payment of fee during business hours.

The Order as made becomes operative on the 20th day of February 1979 being the date on which this notice is first published; but a person aggrieved by the Order may in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 15 of the First Schedule to the Acquisition of Land (Authorisation Procedure) (Scotland) Act 1947 as extended by Section 60 of the Land Compensation (Scotland) Act 1973 by application to the Court of Session within 6 weeks from that date, question its validity on the grounds (i) that the authorisation granted by the Order is not empowered to be granted or (ii) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by failure to comply with any statutory requirement relating to the Order.

The Secretary of State may acquire the land and the rights in land to which this Notice relates by making a General Vesting Declaration under Section 278 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972. Such a declaration shall not be executed before the end of the period of two months beginning with the date of the first publication of this notice except with the consent of every occupier of the land affected. The effect of the making of such a Declaration is to vest the land and the rights in land in the Secretary of State at the end of the appropriate period and is more fully explained in Form 9 contained in The Compulsory Purchase of Land (Scotland) Regulations 1976 (S.I. 1976 No. 820). A copy of the said Regulations has also been deposited and may be seen as aforesaid.

Every person entitled to claim compensation in respect of any interest in the land is invited to give information with respect to his name and address and the land and his interest therein, to the Secretary, Scottish Development Department, New St. Andrew's House, Edinburgh EH1 3SZ.
