## Development above referred to:—

The external painting of buildings, all temporary uses of land, the inspection, repair or renewal of service pipes, cables or other apparatus, the erection and maintenance by a Local Authority of minor works on land owned by it or of items of street furniture required for the operation of any public service, the maintenance or improvement on adjacent land of existing roads, underground development by sewerage authorities, the laying underground of pipes, etc., by water, gas or electricity undertakings, the installation of certain other apparatus by those authorities and drainage schemes by water authorities, the installation of certain equipment and the erection of shelters and barriers by tramway or road transport undertakings and the installation of telephone kiosks and certain other apparatus and lines by the post office.
