

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (SCOTLAND) ACT 1972
ORKNEY STRUCTURE PLAN

THE Secretary of State for Scotland has made a final selection of matters affecting his consideration of the Orkney Structure Plan, and which are to be discussed at an Examination in Public opening on Monday, 19th March 1979 in the Council Chamber, Council Offices, Kirkwall. The matters for debate and the participants invited to discuss them are as follows:

Issue No.

1. The policy whereby uranium mining and extraction processes are not to be permitted in Orkney.
2. The proposal for the establishment of a new roll on/roll off terminal at Hatston, Kirkwall.
3. The need for a statement of policy in the Written Statement on the safeguarding of ancient monuments and sites of archaeological interest.
