but so that any fee wrill be nefundable:
(i) in a case where the panel member has recommended payitieft of a sitin by way of compensation to the complainant im réspect of the packet or its conteits and either no compensation in fespect thereof had been offiered by the Post Office to the complainant before the submission of his complaint to the panel, or the sum recommended exceeds in amount any sumi which the Posit Offiee hadi informed the complainant before such submission that it was prepared to pay (ex gratia) in respect of the packet;
(ii) in enny case in which the panel member expressly fecominends refundiment
(c) to submit aill relevant evidence in the form of written statemients, together with such of the following as may ibe relevanit the cerrificate of posting; in a oase where loss of the pricket is ajleged, a/ declaration by the addressee that the packer was not delivered to him or to the address on thiat certificite ; in case where loss of the packet is alleged, the cover of the packet, the damaged article, its packing material and any container in which the damaged article was enclosed; in a case where loss or abstraction of any of the contents is alileged, the cover of the packet
(4) A complaint relating to a registered inland postal packet or the contents thereof shall not be dealt with (or proceeded further with) pursuapt to such arraingements if the panel's secretariat is notified that legal proceedings under section 30 of the Post loffice Act 1969 in respect of alleged doss or of damage to the packer have been commenced by any person.
(5) A copy of the recommendation of the panel member shall in every case be sent by post to the applicant.
(6) Aiay such arrangemenits may provide for other procedunal matters an dfor time dimits withi pwhich any procedunal steips are to be taken.
(7) The Piost Office shall consider the recommendation of the pariei meitriber before rèaching its final decision whether compensation should be pai dto the applicant (and if so, as to the amount thereof) or refused. Exceipt in a case where the recominendation relates to compensation for doss of or damage to a registered inland packet (in which dase the applicant might seek to recover compensation as of legal right under seection 30 of the Post Ofice Act 1969), slach deccision by the Post Office shall be fipal and conchusive.
