### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Accountant's Office (Bank Buildings) at the Bank of England on Friday, 1st June 1979 at 1.00 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £300,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 4th June 1979 to Friday, 8th June 1979 inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent, (being a multiple of one new halfpenny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative bills are to be dated.

7. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

8. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

Briefly, Section 38 of the Social Security (Determination of Claims and Questions) Regulations 1975 provides that where benefit has been overpaid and the independent adjudicating authorities require repayment, that part of the overpayment equal to the amount which the claimant would otherwise have received as supplementary benefit, had there been no overpayment, is treated as properly paid. The same provision applies to overpayments of increases of benefits for dependants except in certain cases (e.g. a child or adult dependant not residing with the claimant and not being maintained by him).

The draft regulations extend the above provisions to cases of overpaid benefit where the adjudicating authorities decide that repayment is NOT required; the regulations also retain those exceptions contained in the 1975 regulations which apply to dependants.

#### TECHNICAL ANNEX TO PUBLIC NOTICE

Proposed 6 inch flowline between Beryl 'A' Platform and well 9/13-20

At the request of the Secretary of State for Energy and as agreed by the Pipeline Inspector, Mobil North Sea Limited present the following information about the proposed 6 inch flowline from the Beryl 'A' Platform to the wellhead 9/13-20.

#### Flowline Route

The flowline will be from the Beryl 'A' Platform (59° 32' 44.493" N and 01° 32' 16.461" E) to the wellhead 9/13-20 (59° 35' 10" and 01° 32' 01" E). The flowline route is shown on the enclosed index map and will not deviate by more than 100 metres.

#### Burial of Pipelines

As far as is practicable the flowline will be placed and buried in a one metre trench.

#### Pre Commissioning Testing

The flowline will be tested to at least 150% of maximum operating pressure.

#### Flowline Construction

The flowline to be installed will be a modern flexible line as described in the attached technical data sheet. The interlocked spiralled steel carcass, which provides resistance to crushing is covered with a polymar sheath (trade name Rilsan). Additional layers of crossed armoured steel wire provides resistance to longitudinal stress and the complete unit is covered with a second coat of Rilsan for corrosion protection. The guaranteed bursting pressure of these pipelines is many times that of their internal working pressure, and this has been verified by extensive tests conducted under supervision over a two year period.

#### Safety Devices

The flowline will be protected at both ends by shut down valves. There will be 'failsafe' devices which will automatically isolate the lines in the absence or failure of a control signal.

Facilities exist at the Platform for decompression of the flowlines, after they have been isolated from the well. Pressure sensing devices at the platform will automatically initiate flowline shutdown in the event of a significant leakage.

#### Leakage Detection

Significant leakage will be detected by pressure sensing and flow monitoring device at the platform. Routine air and sea surveillance will be used to detect and locate the source of minor leakage.

#### Emergency Action

In the event a leak occurs in the flowline, the following emergency action will be taken:—

1. All petroleum delivery into the affected flowline will be stopped and emergency procedures for decompressing the line will be activated.
2. The procedures laid down for the notification of such incidents will be followed immediately and if necessary, warnings broadcast to all shipping interests.
3. Reconnaissance by air and sea will be carried out to locate the break.
4. In the event that pollution should result from the discharge of crude petroleum fluid, the emergency pollution

control system held in constant readiness by Mobil North Sea and the U.K. Offshore Operators Association will be mobilised.

5. The flowline will be repaired by replacement of the damaged section and its integrity proved to the original specification.
