STRATHCLYDE STRUCTURE PLAN 1979

THE SECRETARY OF STATE has appointed MR. A. G. BELL, B.L., Deputy Chief Reporter, and PROFESSOR G. C. CAMERON to hold an Examination in Public of selected matters affecting his consideration of the Strathclyde Structure Plan. Mr. Bell will be the Chairman. The examination will open on 5th November 1979 at 10.00 a.m. and be held at the Strath-

clyde Regional Council Chambers, 83 Holland Street, Glasgow. The Secretary of State proposes that the matters listed below be examined and that representatives of the organisations and bodies listed below be invited to participate in the examination.

Issue 1 (a)—General examination of the strategy and forecasts, and in particular of the concentration of resources on the inner conurbation and the implications of this for the rest of the Region in terms of housing and employment.

Participants: Scottish Office; Strathclyde Regional Council; all District Councils; all New Town Development Corporations.

Issue 1 (b)—The role of the New Towns.

Participants: Scottish Office; Strathclyde Regional Council; all New Town Development Corporations; Cumbernauld and Kilsyth, Cumnock and Doon Valley, Cunninghame and East Kilbride District Councils; East Kilbride Labour Party; the Town and Country Planning Association.

Issue 2—Policy for housing land, the extent to which the proposed residential policies will assist in improving the attractiveness of the inner conurbation and whether the Plan will allow for adequate provision to be made for housing needs throughout the Region.

Participants: Scottish Office; Strathclyde Regional Council; all District Councils; Scottish Association of Registered House Builders; Bovis; Palmerston Northumberland Partnership; Lawrence Building Company; New Glasgow Society; Scottish Civic Trust.

Issue 3—Examination of the Plan's proposals for large industrial sites (i) in the south-west of the Region; (ii) in and near the Clydeside conurbation (to cover
