(BANFF) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) **ORDER 1979**

- 8. On the east side of High Street from opposite a point 35 metres or thereby south of the south west kerbline of Boyndie Street southwards to a point 15 metres north of its junction with Back Path.
- On the west side of High Street from a point opposite the south east kerbline of Back Path to its junction with Institution Terrace.
- 10. On the west side of High Street from a point 90 metres or thereby south of its junction with Boyndie Street southwands for a distance of 19 metres or thereby.
- 11. On the east side of Castle Street from a point 15 metres or thereby south of its junction with Castle Lane to a point 5 metres or thereby north of its junction with Old Castlegate.
