### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (SCOTLAND) ACT 1972

#### THE STOPPING UP OF HIGHWAY (GARRY PLACE, DUNDEE) ORDER 1979

### DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SECURITY STATE SCHEME PREMIUMS— MARKET LEVEL INDICATORS

THE new state pension scheme which started in April 1978, allows contracted-out occupational pension schemes in certain circumstances, to transfer the responsibility or part of the responsibility, for their members' guaranteed minimum pension rights to the state scheme by the payment of premiums.

The premiums concerned are limited revaluation premiums, accrued rights premiums and pensioners' rights premiums. Their amounts are, in part, related to stock market levels at the time they become due and DHSS each month notifies the average market level indicator to be used in their calculation under the State Scheme Premiums (Actuarial Tables) Regulations 1978 (S.I. 1978 No. 134).

For December 1979 the average market level indicator for accrued rights premiums and limited revaluation premiums is 60. The corresponding average market level indicator for pensioners' rights premiums is 65.

The average market level indicator for ARPs and LRPS shows a decrease of 2 since the previous month. The average market level indicator used for PRPs shows a decrease of 6 since the previous month.

### WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1979

#### LAUNDRY WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN)

THE Laundry Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration as set out in the Wages (Laundry) Order 1979 (Order W(134)); and (2) the revocation of Order W(134).

The Wages Council intends that the revised provisions shall come into operation on 20th February 1980.

### OPENCAST COAL ACT 1958

NOTICE is hereby given that the National Coal Board intend to submit an application entitled the Thornyhill Application 1979 to the Secretary of State for an authorisation under Section 1 of the Opencast Coal Act 1958 to work coal by opencast operations or to cause or permit coal to be worked by such operations. The land which the National Coal Board require to occupy in this connection is described below. A copy of the application and of the accompanying map may be seen between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesday, Thursdays and Fridays, 9.00 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. on Wednesdays and 9.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. on Saturdays, at the N.C.B. Sales District Office, 15-17 Chalmers Street, Dunfermline, Fife, excluding 24th, 25th and 31st December 1979 and January 1st to 5th inclusive, 1980.

Any objection to the application must be made in writing to the Secretary of State at Scottish Economic Planning Department, Industrial Development Division, Alhambra House, 45 Waterloo Street, Glasgow G2 6AT before 22nd January 1980 and should state the grounds of objection.

### DESCRIPTION OF LAND

The land, which extends to about 517 acres (209 hectares), is situated mainly within Dunfermline District in Fife Region but also includes about 2½ acres (1 hectare) within Clackmannan District in Central Region. It lies about 2½ miles west of Saline and about 1½ miles east of Forest Mill and is in two parts separated by the Forest Mill - Saline road (C.36). The larger part, of about 470 acres (190 hectares), is bounded on the north-east by the Dollar - Saline road (B.913) and part of the Black Devon River, on the north by a ridge of high ground called Thorny Hill, on the north-west by a further part of the Black Devon River, on the south-west by the Regional boundary and on the south by the Forest Mill - Saline road. The smaller part, of about 47 acres (19 hectares), is bounded on the north by the Forest Mill - Saline road, on the south-west by an area of woodland and the Regional boundary and on the east by a further area of woodland.
