TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Accountant's Office (Bank Buildings) at the Bank of England on Friday, 23rd November 1979 at 1.00 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £300,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 26th November 1979 to Friday, 30th November 1979 inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent, (being a multiple of one new halfpenny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative bills are to be dated.

7. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

8. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

MONOPOLY REFERENCE: READY MIXED CONCRETE

THE Director General of Fair Trading in exercise of his powers under Sections 47(1), 49(1) and 50(1) of the Fair Trading Act 1973 hereby refers to the Monopolies and Mergers Commission the matter of the existence or possible existence of a monopoly situation in relation to the supply of ready mixed concrete in the United Kingdom.

The Commission shall upon this reference investigate and report in relation to such supply, on the questions whether a monopoly situation exists and, if so:—

- by virtue of which provisions of Section 6 of that Act that monopoly situation is to be taken to exist;
- in favour of what person or persons that monopoly situation exists;
- whether any steps (by way of uncompetitive practices or otherwise) are being taken by that person or those persons for the purpose of exploiting or maintaining the monopoly situation and, if so, by what uncompetitive practices or in what other way;

- whether any action or omission on the part of that person or those persons is attributable to the existence of the monopoly situation and, if so, what action or omission and in what way it is so attributable; and
- whether any facts found by the Commission in pursuance of their investigations under the preceding provisions of this paragraph operate, or may be expected to operate, against the public interest.

For the purposes of this reference:—

- "concrete" means any substance consisting predominantly of a mixture of sand, stone, cement and water, and
- "ready mixed" means mixed to a fresh condition with the required properties for use, whether in a central mixer or truck mixer, and batched elsewhere than at the site where the concrete is required for use.

The Commission shall report on this reference within a period of 18 months from the date of this reference.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SECURITY (MEDICINES ACT 1968)

AMENDMENTS TO VOLUME III OF THE EUROPEAN PHARMACOPOEIA

ON behalf of the Health Ministers, that is to say the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with health in England, in Wales and in Scotland, and on behalf of the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, it is hereby declared under Section 65(8) of the Medicines Act 1968 that on and after 1st January 1980 the Amendments to Volume III of the European Pharmacopoeia set out in the Schedule hereto, which were adopted by the European Pharmacopoeia Commission, on 22nd March 1979 as regards the Amendment to the monograph for Glycerolum (Glycerol) and on 5th July 1979 as regards the Amendments to the monograph for Ricini Oleum (Castor Oil), and published in accordance with the Convention on the Elaboration of a European Pharmacopoeia, are to have effect for the purposes of the said Section 65.

SCHEDULE

GLYCEROLUM (GLYCEROL)

Page 231:

Replace the paragraph entitled 'Reducing substances by the following:—

'Aldehydes and related substances. Introduce 12.5ml of Solution S into a glass-stoppered flask. Add 2.5ml of water and 1ml of decolourised fuchsin solution R. Close the flask and allow to stand for 1h. Any violet colour of the solution is not more intense than that of a reference solution obtained by mixing 0.6ml of 0.1N potassium permanganate and 250ml of water (method II, Vol. I, page 59).'

RICINI OLEUM (CASTOR OIL)

page 342:

Change the requirement for Acid value to:—

"Acid value. (Vol. III, page 57). Dissolve 5.0g in 25ml of the mixture of solvents prescribed. The acid value is not more than 2.0".

Change the requirement for Unsaponifiable matter to:—

"Unsaponifiable matter. (Vol. III, page 62). Not more than 0.8 per cent w/w".

page 343:

Change the requirement for Extinction to:—

"Extinction. (Vol. I, page 83). The extinction of a 1 per cent w/w solution in alcohol R measured in a 1cm cell at the absorption maximum between 268nm and 270nm is not greater than 1.0".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These regulations further amend the Social Security (Benefit) (Married Women and Widows Special Provisions) Regulations 1974. They insert into these regulations a new regulation modifying paragraphs 4(1) and 4A(1) of Schedule 1 to the Social Security Pensions Act 1975 (increase of retirement pension where woman's deceased husband had deferred retirement) in their application to widows who remarried before attaining pensionable age to ensure that such a widow will not inherit increments of pension from a previous husband.
