CITY CENTRE, GLASGOW (DISABLED PERSONS PARKING) ORDER 1979

ON 24th December 1979 the Regional Council made the above-named Orders under Sections 1(1), (2), (3), (3B) and (6), 28, 31, 84B and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

The Orders, which come into operation on 13th January 1979, will (a) regulate traffic in the City Centre and pedestrian part of Argyle Street; and (b) introduce additional parking spaces for disabled drivers in the City Centre.

Copies of the Orders, maps relative thereto and minutes of meeting of the Highways and Transportation Committee of 1st November 1979 are available for inspection between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, at the offices of (i) the Director of Administration, Strathclyde House, 20 India Street, Glasgow, and (ii) the Divisional Roads Engineer, 78 Queen Street, Glasgow.

or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within six weeks from 24th December 1979 apply to the Court of Session for this purpose.
