WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN)

THE Retail Food and Allied Trades Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of proposals for amending the provisions relating to statutory minimum remuneration and holidays and holiday remuneration set out in the Wages (Retail Food and Allied Trades) (Amendment) Order 1980 (Order RF(2)).

The Wages Council intends that the revised provisions shall come into operation on 2nd June 1980.

Particulars of the proposals are contained in the Wages Council's Notice RF(3) copies of which may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below. The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the proposals if made within 14 days from 18th April 1980. PETROLEUM AND SUBMARINE PIPE-LINES ACT 1975

NOTICE OF THE ISSUE OF
SUBMARINE PIPE-LINE WORKS AUTHORISATIONS

THE Secretary of State for Energy hereby gives notice, in accordance with paragraph 9 of Schedule 4 to the Petroleum and Submarine Pipe-lines Act 1975, that works authorisations for the construction and use of three submarine pipe-lines have been issued to the British National Oil Corporation, whose main office is at 150 St. Vincent Street, Glasgow G2 5LJ; ICI Petroleum Limited, whose Registered Office is at Imperial Chemical House, Millbank, London SW1P 3JF; Murphy Petroleum Limited, whose Registered Office is at Winston House, Dollis Park, London N3 1HZ; Ocean Exploration Company Limited, whose Registered Office is c/o Murphy Eastern Oil Company, at Winston House, Dollis Park, London N3 1HZ; BP Petroleum Development Limited, whose Registered Office is at Britannic House, Moor Lane, London ECY2 9BU; Ranger Oil (U.K.) Limited, whose Registered Office is at 69-71 Great Peter Street, London S.W.1; London and Scottish Marine Oil Company Limited, whose Registered Office is at 9 Henrietta House, Henrietta Place, London W1M 9AG; Scottish Canadian Oil and Transportation Company Limited, whose Registered Office is at 9 Henrietta House, Henrietta Place, London W1M 9AG and Chevron Petroleum (U.K.) Limited, whose principal office in the United Kingdom is at Chevron House, 93 Wigmore Street, London W1H 9AA.

One of the pipe-lines will have a diameter of 24 inches, one will have a diameter of 8 inches and the third will have a diameter of 3 inches.

The 24 inch pipe-line will extend between the Ninian Northern Platform at latitude 60° 54' 21.78" North and longitude 01° 25' 16.13" East and the Ninian Central Platform at latitude 60° 51' 24.42" North and longitude 01° 28' 8.73" East; except with the consent of the Secretary of State this pipe-line may only be used to convey crude oil.

The 8 inch pipe-line will extend between the Ninian Southern Platform at latitude 60° 48' 20.97" North and longitude 01° 27' 12.16" East and the Ninian Central Platform; except with the consent of the Secretary of State this pipe-line may only be used to convey LPG/Gas.

The 3 inch pipe-line will extend between subsea wellhead 3/3-5A at latitude 60° 51' 04.99" North and longitude 01° 24' 45.21" East and the Ninian Central Platform; except with the consent of the Secretary of State this pipe-line may only be used to convey crude oil and its associated hydrocarbons and formation water.

All of the pipe-lines may be used by the holders of the authorisations and with their agreement and consent of the Secretary of State, by other persons. Chevron Petroleum (U.K.) Limited has been appointed operator of these pipe-lines.

THE TRUNK ROADS
(40 M.P.H. SPEED LIMIT) (BALMEDIE)
ORDER 19

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make the above Order imposing a 40 m.p.h. Speed Limit on the Perth - Dundee - Aberdeen - Inverness Trunk Road (Route A92) in the Grampian Region at Balmadie from a point 15 metres south of the south kerbline of the B977 road at its junction with the said Trunk Road southwards for a distance of 680 metres.
