TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Registrar's Office (Bank Buildings) at the Bank of England on Friday, 19th September 1980 at 1.00 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £200,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 22nd September 1980 to Friday, 26th September 1980 inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent, (being a multiple of one new halfpenny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative bills are to be dated.

7. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

POST OFFICE SCHEME T5/1980

NOTE: The Scheme which follows this Note has been made under section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and will come into operation on 1st October 1980. It amends the Post Office Telecommunication Scheme 1976 (Post Office Scheme T1/1976) as amended by the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1976 (Post Office Scheme T2/1976), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 2A) Scheme 1977 (Post Office Scheme T1A/1977), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1978 (Post Office Scheme T1/1978), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 4) Scheme 1978 (Post Office Scheme T2/1978), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 5) Scheme 1979 (Post Office Scheme T1/1979), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 6) Scheme 1979 (Post Office Scheme T2/1979), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 7) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme T1/1980), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 8) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme T3/1980) and the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 9) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme T4/1980).

The principal changes are increases in the rates of rental for telex exchange lines; and increases in the connection charges and rates of rental for items of subsidiary apparatus provided in relation to telex exchange lines and telegraph and private circuits; increases in additional rental and single payment charges for Special Range Telephones; increases in certain single payment charges and occasional charges for miscellaneous equipment and apparatus, services and facilities; for removals, alterations and substitution of equipment and apparatus and increases in charges for services and facilities in relation to particular telex calls.

THE POST OFFICE TELECOMMUNICATION AMENDMENT (No. 10) SCHEME 1980

Made	19th September 1980
Coming into operation	1st October 1980

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement and Citation

1. This Scheme shall come into operation on the 1st October 1980 and may be cited as the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 10) Scheme 1980.

Interpretation

- 2.—(1) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Telecommunication Scheme 1976 (Post Office Scheme T1/1976) (hereinafter called "the principal Scheme") as amended by the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1976 (Post Office Scheme T2/1976), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 2A) Scheme 1977 (Post Office Scheme T1A/1977), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1978 (Post Office Scheme T1/1978), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 4) Scheme 1978 (Post Office Scheme T2/1978), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 5) Scheme 1979 (Post Office Scheme T1/1979), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 6) Scheme 1979 (Post Office Scheme T2/1979), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 7) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme T1/1980), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 8) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme T3/1980) and the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 9) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme T4/1980).

- (2) The Interpretation Act 1978 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

International Facsimile Bureau Service

3. After paragraph 34 of the principal Scheme there shall be inserted the following additional paragraph:

"International facsimile bureau service

34A.—(1) A person may tender in such manner by such means and in such form as the Post Office may from time to time determine a message for transmission through the medium of the Post Office international facsimile bureau service and delivery as a facsimile of the message to any place outside the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man in respect of which such service is from time to time available.

- (2) The said service shall be subject to the applicable provisions of this Scheme and such additional terms and conditions as may be determined by the Post Office from time to time in accordance with paragraph 13(h) of this Scheme.

- (3) The charges for the said service shall be such as the Post Office may fix."

Restrictions on assignment of telephone service and use of telephone installation

4. For paragraph 44(2)(a) of the principal Scheme there shall be substituted the following paragraph:

"(a) unless the Post Office otherwise consents in writing, a subscriber who is engaged in the business of sending and receiving messages on behalf of other persons by means of his telephone installation and/or allowing other

persons to use his telephone installation for the purpose of sending and receiving messages on their own behalf shall not so use or allow his telephone installation to be so used for the purpose of sending to or receiving from a place outside the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man any message intended for ultimate reception in visual form unless it is a message transmitted through the medium of the Post Office international facsimile bureau service."
