WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1979

OSTRICH AND FANCY FEATHER AND ARTIFICIAL
FLOWER WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN)

THE Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of proposals for (1) varying the statutory minimum remuneration as set out in the Wages (Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower) Order 1979 (Order OF(68)); (2) amending the provisions relating to holidays and holiday remuneration as set out in the Wages (Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower) (Holidays) Order 1978 (Order OF(66)); and (3) the revocation of Orders OF(66) and OF(68).

The Wages Council intends that the revised provisions shall come into operation on 20th October 1980.

Particulars of the proposals are contained in the Wages Council's Notice OF(69), copies of which may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below. The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the proposals if made within 14 days from 14th October 1980.

Any such representation should bear the writer's address and signature and be sent to the Secretary, Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower Wages Council (Great Britain), 12 St. James's Square, London SW1Y 4LL. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections and quote the number of the Wages Council's Notice of Proposals OF(69).

STATE SCHEME PREMIUMS:
MARKET LEVEL INDICATORS

THE new state pension scheme which started in April 1978, allows contracted-out occupational pension schemes in certain circumstances, to transfer the responsibility or part of the responsibility, for their members' guaranteed minimum pension rights to the state scheme by the payment of premiums.

The premiums concerned are limited revaluation premiums, accrued rights premiums and pensioners' rights premiums. Their amounts are, in part, related to stock market levels at the time they become due and DHSS each month notifies the average market level indicator to be used in their calculation under the State Scheme Premiums (Actuarial Tables) Regulations 1978 (S.I. 1978 No. 134).

For October 1980 the average market level indicator for accrued rights premiums and limited revaluation premiums is 67. The corresponding average market level indicator for pensioners' rights premiums is 72.

The average market level indicator for ARPs and LRPS shows an increase of 1 since the previous month. The average market level indicator used for PRPs shows an increase of 2 since the previous month.
