CERTIFICATES OF TAX DEPOSIT (SERIES 5)

CONSERVATION AREAS

IN accordance with Section 262 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972 as substituted by Section 2(1) of the Town and Country Amenities Act 1974, Kyle and Carrick District Council have designated an additional Conservation Area at St. Quivox in Ayr Landward Parish and have amended

the boundaries of the Ayr 1 and 2 Conservation Areas. The details are as follows:—

ST. QUIVOX

The Conservation Area has an area of 1.35 acres and includes four properties which are classified as Listed Buildings, namely, The Parish Church and Churchyard, St. Evøx Cottage, St. Quivox House (formerly the manse) and Mount Hamilton. In addition to the individual merits of the above buildings the area has a specific character created by the local topography and the inter-relationship of the buildings to one another, and the mature tree planting in the area.

AYR 1 (TOWN CENTRE)

This Conservation Area which was designated in October 1976 presently includes much of the commercial core of the town and stretches from the River Ayr in the north east to Queens Terrace Lane on the west and Burns Statue Square to the south. The District Council have agreed to extend the boundary to include Kyle Street, Alloway Park, Park Terrace, Miller Road, 5 and 5a Racecourse Road and 66-72 Dalblair Road.

AYR 2 (RACECOURSE ROAD)

This Conservation Area was also designated in October 1976, is centred on Racecourse Road and is characterised by large Victorian mansions set within mature landscaped grounds. The District Council have agreed that the boundary of this area be extended to include Fairfield Road, Bellevue Crescent, Park Circus, and numbers 7-9 Racecourse Road.
