**THE FIFE REGIONAL COUNCIL
(CAMPBELL STREET, DUNFERMLINE)
(PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND
LOADING) (REVOCATION)
ORDER 1981**

1. ON the 28th April 1981, The Fife Regional Council made the above-named Order under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) and 84D(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Section 133 of and Schedule 14 to the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973.
2. The effect of the Order, which will come into operation on 6th May 1981, is to relax the present waiting restrictions on the north side of Campbell Street, Dunfermline and the present loading restrictions on the south side of Campbell Street, Dunfermline, respectively. The City and Royal Burgh of Dunfermline (Various Streets) One-Way Traffic, Unilateral Waiting and Prohibition of Waiting (No. 1) Order 1971 is revoked to that extent.
3. A copy of the Order and relative Map showing the length of road affected, together with a copy of the 1971 Order partially revoked, is available for inspection during normal office hours at Fife Regional Council Headquarters, Fife House, North Street, Glenrothes and at Fife Regional Council Area Office, 34 Viewfield Terrace, Dunfermline, respectively.
4. Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks from 28th April 1981, apply to the Court of Session for this purpose.
