TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Registrar's Office (Bank Buildings) at the Bank of England on Friday, 23rd October 1981 at 1.00 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £100,000,000.
2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 26th October 1981 to Friday, 30th October 1981 inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.
3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (Being a multiple of one new halfpenny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.
8. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

THE TRUNK ROADS
(ROUTE M90) (PITREAVIE SPUR)
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC)
ORDER 1981

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make the above Order temporarily prohibiting the driving of vehicles whilst temporary roadworks, indicated by the appropriate traffic signs, are in progress on that length or part of that length of trunk road (Route M90) known as Pitreavie Spur in Fife Region from its junction at Masterton Interchange with the Inverkeithing-Perth Trunk Road (Route M90) westwards to its junction at Pitreavie Roundabout with the Dunfermline-Rosyth Principal Road (Route A823) and the North Queensferry-Rosyth Road (Route B980), a distance of 1.6 kilometres. The closures which are necessary to allow for work in connection with the hardshoulders will take place from 1st November 1981 until 14th June 1982.

(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC)
ORDER 1981

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make the above Order temporarily prohibiting the driving of vehicles whilst temporary roadworks, indicated by the appropriate traffic signs, are in progress on that length or part of that length of the Inverkeithing-Perth Trunk Road (Route M90) in Fife Region from a point 278 metres south of the south abutment of the south bridge at Admiralty Interchange carrying the said trunk road over the Kincardine-Kirkcaldy Trunk Road (Route A92/A985) northwards for a distance of 3.2 kilometres.
