PRIVATE LEGISLATION PROCEDURE (SCOTLAND) ACT 1936

NOTICE is hereby given in terms of Section 1(4) of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1936, that the Secretary of State, the Chairman of Committees of the House of Lords and the Chairman of Ways and Means in the House of Commons having considered representations by The National Bank of Australasia Limited that it is expedient that the under-mentioned Parliamentary powers to be operative in Scotland and elsewhere which the said Bank desire to obtain should be conferred by one enactment have decided that the said powers would more properly be obtained by the promotion of a Private Bill than by the promotion of a Private Bill and of a Provisional Order under the said Act:—

- To transfer to The National Bank of Australasia Limited (hereinafter called "the continuing Bank") the banking undetaking of The Commercial Banking Company of Sydney (hereinafter called "C.B.C.").
- To transfer to National Nominees Limited (a wholly owned subsidiary of the continuing Bank) all property held as trustee by Commercial Nominees Pty. Limited (a wholly owned subsidiary of C.B.C.).
- To enact provisions in furtherance of and consequential upon such respective transfers.
