**GENERAL CONDITIONAL LICENCE FOR THE ONWARD
MOVEMENT OF BIRDS, POULTRY AND HATCHING EGGS**

THE Secretary of State for Scotland, by this licence issued under Article 4 of the Importation of Birds, Poultry and Hatching Eggs Order 1979 authorises subject to and in accordance with the conditions set out below the landing in Scotland of captive birds, poultry and hatching eggs from any country at any port or airport in Scotland for onward movement from Scotland. This licence is valid from date of issue until 31st December 1984. The Secretary of State for Scotland may, by notice, vary or revoke this licence.

CONDITIONS ATTACHING TO THIS LICENCE

1. When travelling to Scotland, the birds/poultry/hatching eggs must travel as manifested freight in the freight compartment of the aircraft, and must not travel in the passenger compartment or as excess passenger baggage.
2. Each consignment of birds/poultry/hatching eggs must be re-exported within 48 hours of landing. When a consignment has not been re-exported within that time, the fact must be reported to an inspector of the Ministry who must be informed of the reason for delay.

3. Each consignment of birds/poultry/hatching eggs must enter and leave Scotland by the same port or airport.
4. Birds/poultry/hatching eggs imported under the terms of this licence while in Scotland shall be kept isolated from all other birds, poultry and hatching eggs not landed under the terms of this licence, and from all other animals.

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

**GENERAL LICENCE GRANTED BY THE SECRETARY OF
STATE FOR SCOTLAND TO PERMIT THE RELEASE INTO
THE WILD OF THE SPECIES OF FISH AND
SHELLFISH MENTIONED BELOW**

1. THE Secretary of State for Scotland, in exercise of the powers vested in him under Section 16(4) and (5) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby grants a general licence, in accordance with the terms of Section 16(5)(a) of the said Act, to all persons to release into the wild Ran-

bow Trout (*Salmo gairdneri*), Pacific or Japanese Oysters (*Crassostrea gigas*) or Portuguese Oysters (*Crassostrea angulata*) or any eggs or spat of those species.

2. This licence is not in derogation of, nor does it affect in any way the need to obtain, in respect of the release of oysters of the species mentioned, a licence under the Molluscan Shellfish (Control of Deposit) (Scotland) Order 1978 or any subsequent Order made under Section 12 of the Sea Fisheries (Shellfish) Act 1967 as amended.
3. This licence extends to Scotland only and shall be valid for a period of five years until 31st December 1988.
4. The release of Rainbow Trout (*Salmo gairdneri*) in terms of this licence shall be subject to the condition that the licensee shall prior to the release obtain the written consent of the proprietors of the waters into which that species is to be released and the consent of the proprietors of any fisheries in those waters.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury read Section 3(2) of the National Loans Act 1968 (1968 C.13 as amended) whereby any sums borrowed from the Public Works Loan Commissioners shall bear

interest at such rates as the Treasury may determine from time to time in accordance with Section 5 of the said Act.

My Lords understand that the Public Works Loan Commissioners will be operating arrangements under which local authorities are permitted to borrow from the Commissioners up to a specified quota at a certain fixed rate of interest and in excess of such quota at one of two higher fixed rates.

In accordance therewith the Chancellor of the Exchequer now recommends that with effect from 11th January 1984 and until the coming into operation of a further determination:

- I. The rate of interest applicable to any such fixed rate loan will be that in force on the day the authority applies to borrow or, if the application is before noon three working days before the loan is credited to the account of the authority's banker, the rate in force at 11 a.m. two banking days before credit day;
- II. Different rates of interest shall be charged on such fixed rate loans according to whether the principal of a loan is repaid by instalments or at the maturity and, if repaid by instalments, whether by equal instalments of the principal with interest paid on the decreasing balance of the principal (E.I.P.), or by instalments of equal repayments of the principal and interest paid thereon (E.R.);
