- (iii)
 - (a) *Brucella ovis* does not exist in the Republic of Ireland;
 - (b) Contagious agalactia (infections with *Mycoplasma agalactiae*, *M. capricolum* and *M. mycoides* var *mycoides*) has not been recorded in the Republic of Ireland during the previous 3 years.
- (iv) As far as can be ascertained, and after due enquiry of the owner, his veterinary surgeon and the Veterinary Services of the Government of the Republic of Ireland, there has been no clinical, serological or pathological evidence in any susceptible animal on the premises of origin of the goats to be exported of:
 - (a) Brucellosis (including *Brucella abortus*, *Brucella melitensis* and *Brucella ovis* infection), Johne's disease, leptospirosis, listeriosis and tuberculosis during the 12 month period immediately prior to export;
 - (b) Scrapie and caprine encephalitis arthritidis syndrome during the 3 year period immediately prior to export.
- (v) None of the goats to be exported has been vaccinated against brucellosis.
- (vi)
 - (a) A written declaration has been received from the owner of the animals stating that as far as can be determined the sires, dams and siblings of the goats to be exported have shown no evidence of genetic defects.
 - (b) On examination by the certifying officer, the animals to be exported showed no evidence of genetic defects.
- (vii) As far as can be ascertained and after due enquiry of the owner, none of the female goats has been mated naturally or artificially and none of the males has been used for natural service.
- (viii)
 - (a) Within 3 months prior to entry into on farm isolation, all goats over the age of 12 months in the herd of origin of the goats to be exported were subjected to the agar gel immunodiffusion test or enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay for caprine arthritis encephalitis (CAE) (using the maedi/visna or CAE antigen) at (laboratory) with negative results.
 - (b) Between the date of the herd test at viii(a) and the entry of the goats into on-farm isolation, goats were added to the herd only by *direct movement from herds* which had undergone a herd test for

caprine encephalitis arthritidis with negative results within the three months immediately preceding their movement.

- (c) No goat to be exported is the progeny of a dam which has at any time shown clinical signs suggestive of caprine encephalitis arthritidis or given a positive result to any laboratory test for CAE.
- (ix) All the goats to be exported were isolated from all other animals on their premises of origin for a minimum period of 30 days immediately prior to export. During this period of isolation the goats were submitted to the following tests, with negative results:
 - (a) the single intradermal tuberculin test using both Weybridge avian and bovine tuberculins (a positive result is an increase in skin thickness of more than 2mm or any reaction showing oedema to either tuberculin when read at 72 hours);
 - (b) the serum agglutination test (SAT) for brucellosis (*Brucella abortus* antigen) (negative is a titre of less than 30 ius/ml);
 - (c) the complement fixation test (CFT) for brucellosis (*Brucella abortus* antigen) (negative is a titre of less than 8.3 icftu/ml);
 - (d) the complement fixation test (CFT) for brucellosis (*Brucella ovis* antigen) (negative is no reaction at a dilution of 1 in 5);
 - (e) the agar gel immuno diffusion test (AGIDT) or enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay (ELISA) for caprine encephalitis arthritidis (CAE) using the maedi visna or CAE antigen;
 - (f) 2 complement fixation tests (CFT) for contagious agalactia using *M. agalactiae*, *M. capricolum* and *M. mycoides* subsp *mycoides* LC antigens; the second test at not less than 21 days after the first.
 - (g) EITHER
 - (a) were subjected to blood sampling for submission to the microscopic agglutination test using live antigen for leptospira, serotypes australis, grippotyphosa, pomona and tarassovi with negative results (negative is less than 50% agglutination at a serum dilution of 1 in 199);
 - OR
 - (b) received 2 injections of dihydrostreptomycin (25 mg per kg live body weight) at an interval of 14 days, the second injection being given within 24 hours of the intended date of export.
