GRAMPIAN REGIONAL COUNCIL**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984****THE GRAMPIAN REGIONAL COUNCIL (OFF-STREET
CAR PARKS) (AMENDMENT) ORDER 1986**

THE Grampian Regional Council proposes to make the above-named Order under Section 35, and Part 3 of Schedule 9, of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The effect of the Order will be to eliminate charging for the use of the car parks at Riverside Drive and Crombie Road, both in Aberdeen, and to reduce the charges in respect of the car park at Skene Square to 10p for up to 2 hours, 20p for 2-4 hours, and 50p for 4-10 hours.

The Order will also permit cars to park on the South College Street Car Park, Aberdeen, between 8.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. from Mondays to Saturdays at a charge of 10p for up to 2 hours, 20p for 2-4 hours, and 50p for 4-9 hours, and heavy goods vehicles to park between 6 p.m. and 8 a.m. from Mondays to Saturdays, and all day Sundays, at a charge of £1 for each continuous period of availability. Therefore, it should be noted that a continuous period is available at weekends from 6 p.m. on Saturdays until 8 a.m. on Mondays.

Full details of the proposals are in the draft Order which, together with maps showing the car parks affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined during normal office hours in the Department of Roads, Woodhill House, Ashgrove Road West, Aberdeen, and at the offices of the Divisional Road Surveyor, St. Nicholas House, Broad Street, Aberdeen.

Any person wishing to object to the proposed Order should send details of the grounds for objection to the undersigned by 20th June 1986.
