

## FAIR TRADING ACT 1973

REFERENCE TO MONOPOLIES AND MERGERS COMMISSION  
THE SUPPLY OF BEER

THE Director General of Fair Trading in exercise of his powers under sections 47(1), 49(1) and 50(1) of the Fair Trading Act 1973 hereby refers to the Monopolies and Mergers Commission the matter of the existence or the possible existence of a monopoly situation in relation to the supply of beer within the United Kingdom for retail sale on licensed premises.

The Commission shall investigate and report on the questions whether a monopoly situation exists and if so;

- (a) by virtue of which provisions of sections 6 to 8 of the said Act that monopoly situation is to be taken to exist;
- (b) in favour of what person or persons that monopoly situation exists;
- (c) whether any steps (by way of uncompetitive practices or otherwise) are being taken by that person or persons for the purpose of exploiting or maintaining the monopoly situation and, if so, by what uncompetitive practices or in what other way;
- (d) whether any act or omission on the part of that person or those persons is attributable to the existence of that monopoly situation and if so what act or omission and in what way it is so attributable; and
- (e) whether any facts found by the Commission in pursuance of their investigations under the preceding provisions of this paragraph operate or may be expected to operate against the public interest.

The Commission shall report upon this reference within a period of 2 years from the date hereof.

## PETROLEUM AND SUBMARINE PIPE-LINES ACT 1975

NOTICE OF THE ISSUE OF A SUBMARINE  
PIPE-LINE WORKS AUTHORISATION

THE Secretary of State for Energy hereby gives notice that he has decided to issue, and in consequence has issued, a works authorisation to Shell U.K. Limited for the construction and use of a pipeline in the Indefatigable Field from Platform 49/24-N to Platform 49/24-K.

Except with the consent of the Secretary of State, the pipeline may only be used to convey natural gas, condensate, water mixture.

The pipeline may be used by the holder and with the holder's agreement and, with the consent of the Secretary of State, by other persons.

Shell U.K. Limited have been appointed operator of the pipeline.

THE TRUNK ROADS (ROUTE M80) (DENNY)  
(TEMPORARY CLOSURE) ORDER 1986

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make the above Order temporarily closing that length of the southbound carriageway of the Glasgow-Stirling motorway (Route M80) at Denny from a point 378 metres north of the bridge carrying the unclassified road to Cuthelton Green over the motorway to a point 170 metres south of the bridge carrying the unnumbered classified road to Drumbowie over the motorway, a distance of 1262 metres (contraflow will operate on the northbound carriageway).

The Order which is required to allow essential maintenance work to be carried out will operate from 16th August to 27th September 1986.

Restrictions will only apply in the immediate vicinity of the works and where indicated by the appropriate traffic signs.

## STOPPING-UP OF ROAD (PARK PLACE, ABERDEEN)

## ORDER 1986

THE City of Aberdeen District Council hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 198A of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972, as amended which will be submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation or confirmed as an unopposed Order authorising the stopping-up of the public road known as Park Place, Aberdeen at its junction with Park Street, which length of road is shown coloured red and hatched in black on the plan annexed to the Order. The effect of the Order is to close the foresaid road permanently by terminating the rights of passage for vehicles for the purpose of enabling the construction of a residential development of 53 houses at Princes Street, Aberdeen, by Scottish Special Housing Association.

Copies of the Order and of the plan illustrating the road to be stopped-up may be inspected at the offices of the City of Aberdeen District Council at the Town House (Department of Law and Administration), Castle Street, Aberdeen and at St. Nicholas House, (Department of Planning and Building Control), Broad Street, Aberdeen, by any person free of charge, at all reasonable hours during a period of 28 days from the date of this Notice.

Within the foresaid statutory period, any person may, by notice in writing to the Director of Law and Administration of the City of Aberdeen District Council, Town House, Aberdeen, make representations or objections to the making of the Order.

## STOPPING-UP OF ROAD (GAITSIDE DRIVE, ABERDEEN)

## ORDER 1986

THE City of Aberdeen District Council hereby give notice that they have confirmed as an unopposed Order the Stopping-Up of Road (Gaitside Drive, Aberdeen) Order 1986 made by them under Section 198A of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972, as amended authorising the stopping-up of the public road known as Gaitside Drive, Aberdeen from its junction with Inchbrae Terrace to its junction with Garthdee Road, which length of road is shown coloured red and hatched in black on the plan annexed to the Order. The effect of the Order is to close the foresaid length of road permanently by terminating the rights of passage both for vehicles and for pedestrians for the purpose of enabling the demolition and replacement of 176 Orlit houses at Garthdee by the Scottish Special Housing Association.
