THE FIFE REGIONAL COUNCIL (CENTRAL AREA, LEVEN) (PEDESTRIAN FAVOURED PRECINCT AND WAITING RESTRICTIONS) (AMENDMENT) (NO.2) ORDER 1986

- ON the 28th October 1986, The Fife Regional Council made an Order under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) and (2) and 124 of and paragraphs 20(1) and 27(1) of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984.
- The effect of the Order which comes into operation on 3rd November 1986, is to prohibit waiting at any time in a length of the south-east side of Durie Street, Leven, in place of the existing waiting restrictions. The Order will also have the effect of amending The Fife Regional Council (Central Area, Leven) (Pedestrian Favoured

Precinct and Waiting Restrictions) Order 1983 accordingly and amending the Burgh of Leven (Various Streets) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1966 in so far as inconsistent with the Order.

- A copy of the Order together with a map showing the length of road which will be affected and copies of the Orders to be amended may be examined during normal office hours at The Fife Regional Council Headquarters, Fife House, North Street, Glenrothes and at The Centre, Commercial Road, Leven.
- Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks from 28th October 1986, apply to the Court of Session for the purpose.

THE FIFE REGIONAL COUNCIL (MOODIE STREET, PRIORY LANE ETC. DUNFERMLINE) (BUS STOP CLEARWAY AND PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 1986

- ON 28th October 1986, The Fife Regional Council made an Order under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) and (2), 3(2) and 124 of and paragraph 20(1) and 27(1) of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984.
- The effect of the Order which comes into operation on 3rd November 1986, is:-
 - to prohibit the waiting of vehicles other than buses at any time at any bus stop in either Priory Lane or Moodie Street, Dunfermline.
Exceptions will permit waiting for the purpose of:-
 - the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road
 - adjacent demolition or building operations
 - removing any obstruction to traffic
 - emergency services or postal delivery or collection
 - local authority refuse collection
 - essential servicing of adjacent premises
 - legal requirement to stop
 - disabled drivers
 - avoiding an accident and
 - circumstances outwith the driver's control respectively
 - to prohibit or restrict the waiting of vehicles on certain lengths of both sides of Priory Lane, Dunfermline and to prohibit the waiting of vehicles on both sides of various streets in Dunfermline.
 - to amend the The Fife Regional Council (Nethertown Broad Street/New Row/East Port, Dunfermline) Traffic Regulation Order 1980 accordingly.
