**GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE**

THE Secretary of State for Scotland, by this licence issued under the

terms of Article 4 of the Importation of Animal Products and Poultry Products Order 1980 (as amended), authorises subject to and in accordance with the conditions set out below the landing in Scotland of Poultry meat and Poultry meat products from Republic of Ireland, at all ports and airports in Scotland, until further notice unless revoked by the Secretary of State.

**CONDITIONS ATTACHING TO THIS LICENCE**

- A. Each consignment must be accompanied by a certificate in accordance with the terms of the Council Directive on health problems affecting intra-Community trade in meat products 77/99 EEC signed by an official veterinarian of the country of signing.
- B. In addition each consignment must be accompanied by the following supplementary certification.
  - either;
  - 1. The poultrymeat products have been prepared from domestic chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese or guinea fowl and have undergone heat treatment in a hermetically sealed container with an FC value of 3.00 or more, or have undergone heat treatment in which the internal temperature is raised to at least 70 degrees C.
  - or:
  - 2 (a) The poultrymeat products are being prepared from domestic chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese, or guinea fowl which:
    - (i) have not been resident at any time since 7th January 1987 within 20km of an outbreak of avian influenza.
    - (ii) have not been slaughtered or cut up since 7th January 1987 on premises within 20km of an outbreak of avian influenza, and
  - (b) The poultrymeat products have not been produced since 7th January 1987 at a meat products plant within 20km of an outbreak of avian influenza.
- C. Any product imported under this licence shall be made available if so required for inspection by an Officer of the Ministry at any place nominated by him for such inspection. The importer or his agent shall afford all assistance necessary to such an officer to enable him to carry out the inspection in such manner as he shall determine and the importer shall be responsible for meeting any costs of carrying out such an inspection.

**NOTES**

1. This licence will not be invalidated by transit of the goods through any other country provided that if the goods are examined by Customs en-route the vehicle is resealed and the documents endorsed accordingly.
2. Nothing in this licence gives exemption from any prohibition or restriction imposed by the Imported Food Regulations 1968 or the Medicines Act 1968 and 1971, or by any regulation superseding or amending the same, or any prohibition, regulation or restriction imposed by the Department of Trade and Industry.
3. This is not a Department of Trade and Industry Licence.

**CAUTION**

Any breach of any conditions attached to this licence will constitute an offence against the Animal Health Act 1981.

**GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE**

THE Secretary of State for Scotland, by this licence issued under the terms of Article 4 of the Importation of Animal Products and Poultry Products Order 1980 (as amended), authorises subject to and in accordance with the conditions set out below the landing in Scotland of Fresh/refrigerated carcasses/part carcasses and/or offal derived from chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese and guinea fowl from Republic of Ireland, at all ports and airports in Scotland, until further notice unless revoked by the Secretary of State.

**CONDITIONS ATTACHING TO THIS LICENCE**

- A. Each consignment must be accompanied by a certificate in accordance with the terms of the Council Directive on health problems affecting trade in fresh poultry meat 71/118 EEC as amended, signed by an official veterinarian of the country of origin certifying.
  1. Details of consignment ie species, nature of cuts, packaging, weight;
  2. Address(es) and Veterinary approval number(s) of the slaughterhouse(s);
  3. Destination of meat, means of transport including registration/flight no;
  4. Health attestation:
    - (a) the poultry meat/packaging described above bears a mark providing that the meat comes from animals slaughtered in approved slaughterhouses.

(b) this meat has been passed fit for human consumption following a veterinary inspection carried out in accordance with the Council Directive of 15th February 1971 on health problems affecting trade in fresh poultrymeat.

(c) the transport vehicles or containers and the loading conditions of this consignment meet the hygiene requirements laid down in the Directive.

- B. In addition each consignment must be accompanied by the following supplementary certification.

Either

1. The poultrymeat products have been prepared from domestic chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese or guinea fowl and have undergone heat treatment in a hermetically sealed container with an FC value of 3.00 or more, or have undergone heat treatment in which the internal temperature is raised to at least 70 degrees C.  
or:
- 2 (a) The Poultrymeat products are being prepared from domestic chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese, or guinea fowl which:
  - (i) have not been resident at any time since 7th January 1987 within 20km of an outbreak of avian influenza,
  - (ii) have not been slaughtered or cut up since 7th January 1987 on premises within 20km of an outbreak of avian influenza, and
- (b) The poultrymeat products have not been produced since 7th January 1987 at a meat products plant within 20km of an outbreak of avian influenza.

**NOTES**

1. Fresh poultry meat; fresh meat from domestic fowls (chicken, turkeys, ducks, geese, guinea fowl) which has not been treated to ensure preservation; however, poultrymeat which has been chilled or frozen shall be considered fresh.
2. The licence will not be invalidated by transit of goods through other countries provided they are transported in a sealed container and provided that if the goods are examined by Customs en-route the container is resealed and the documents are endorsed accordingly.

**NOTES**

1. Nothing in this licence gives exemption from any prohibition or restriction imposed by the Imported Food Regulations 1968 or the Medicines Act 1968 and 1971, or by any restriction imposed by the Department of Trade and Industry.
2. This is not a Department of Trade and Industry Licence.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Scotland has made the following Order:

**THE BRUCELLOSIS (SCOTLAND) AMENDMENT ORDER 1987**

This Order which came into force on 9th February 1987, extends the Secretary of State's powers to approve premises used by dealers who regularly buy pregnant cattle for re-sale within 30 days of their expected calving date, or within 30 days of their having calved, the time at which they are most likely to spread Brucellosis.

The Order also provides for the control of Brucellosis infection from animals other than cattle. It allows a veterinary inspector where he reasonably believes that infection exists, to serve a Notice on an occupier of premises requiring him to keep such animals under control, or confined, thereby reducing the risk of spread of infection.

**THE IMPORTED FOOD (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 1985**

**HEALTH MARK : ROMANIA**

THE Secretary of State for Scotland, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food (Scotland) Regulations 1985 (SI 1985, No 913), gives notice that he hereby recognises, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the health marks described in Part 1 of the Schedule hereto for the importation from Romania of fresh meat and meat products as showing:

- (a) that the fresh meat to which they relate, or the meat from which the meat product to which they relate was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and immediately after death and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Secretary of State; and
- (b) that dressing, packing and other preparation of the fresh meat or meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

The said health marks are recognised subject to the following conditions:

- (i) recognition applies only to fresh meat and meat products imported from Romania but does not apply to any such meat derived from mammals killed when wild;
- (ii) recognition of the health mark is restricted to meat and meat products in which levels of CAESIUM 134 and 137, taken together, do not exceed 600 Bq/kg;
- (iii) where the health mark is in the form of a stamp or a label, recognition will apply only if the stamp or label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as a health mark.

Recognition of the health marks is restricted to the extent shown in Part 2 of the Schedule hereto.

The Notices published in The Edinburgh Gazette dated 13th June 1986 and 24th January 1984 are hereby revoked.

**SCHEDULE**

**PART 1**

- (A) For fresh meat of domestic bovine animals (including buffalo), pigs, sheep, goats and solipeds, the health mark shall consist of:

A brand, label, mark, stamp or other voucher bearing the following details within an oval surround 6.5 cm wide by 4.5 cm high:

on the upper part:

the name ROMANIA in capitals or, if appropriate, the initial approved for that country under the International Convention on Motor Vehicle Registration, viz: R.

in the centre:

the veterinary approval number of the establishment, which shall be one of those listed in Part 2 of this Schedule.

The letters must be 0.8 cm high and the figures 1 cm high. The health mark may include an indication of the official veterinarian who carried out the health inspection of the meat.

- (B) For meat products including canned meat but excluding meat products derived in whole or in part from poultry meat, the health mark shall consist of:

A brand, label, mark, stamp or other voucher bearing the following design:

The health mark must be completed by the insertion of the approved establishment number.

The recognition of a health mark for public health purposes does not give exemption from such restrictions or prohibitions.

The purpose of the proposed modifications described below is to allow British Telecom, Hull and Mercury ("the 3 PTOs") to offer Value Added and Data Services on an equitable competitive basis with other providers of such services.
- 3. The principal proposed modifications are —

**Publication of prices.** The prices of Value Added and Data Services ("Relevant Services") must be published at least one day before they take effect and when offering to provide such services, the 3 PTOs may publish their charges for the service as a whole.

**Undue Preference and Undue Discrimination.** The 3 PTOs will be prohibited from showing undue preference to, or exercising undue discrimination against, any persons as respects the provision of Relevant Services.

**Cross-Subsidisation.** The 3 PTOs will be prohibited from unfairly cross-subsidising their Supplemental Services Businesses (that is, that part of their business which provides Relevant Services).

**Accounting Provisions.** The 3 PTOs will have to maintain separate accounting records in respect of their Supplemental Services Businesses.

*Alterations to the PTOs Telecommunication Systems.* The 3 PTOs will have to inform the Director and give public notice of any proposals for changes to the means of access to a Relevant Service.

*Numbering Arrangements.* The 3 PTOs will have to adopt a numbering plan for the allocation of certain classes of numbers in respect of Relevant Services.

*Linked Sales.* The existing restrictions on linked sales will also apply to the provision of Relevant Services.

*Code of Practice on the Confidentiality of Customer Information.* The 3 PTOs will have to ensure that their employees who are engaged in their Supplemental Services Businesses observe the provisions of a Code of Practice which specifies the persons to whom they may not disclose information about a customer and regulates the information about a customer which may be disclosed without his consent.

*Means of Access which conform to OSI Standards.* The 3 PTOs will have to ensure that where an OSI Standard is specified by the Director, then means of access to any Relevant Service will have to conform to any applicable OSI Standard.

There are also a number of minor modifications designed to secure the purpose set out in 2 above and a number of consequential modifications.

4. The Director is required by section 12 (2) of the Act to consider any representations or objections which are duly made and are not withdrawn.
5.
