A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE P. R.

Whereas the Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the 1st day of November next, We, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, and by and with the advice of his Majesty's Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said 1st day of November to Tuesday the 8th day of said month; and We have given order to the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Great Britain, to prepare a commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And we do further hereby, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, and by and with the advice aforesaid, publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall, on the 8th day of November next, be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said 8th day of November next.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, the 24th day of September 1814, in the 54th year of his Majesty's reign:

GOD save the KING.

At the Court at Carlton-House, the 24th of September 1814,
PRESENT,
His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

This day the Right Honourable Sir Charles Stuart, K. B. was, by his Royal Highness's command, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, sworn of his Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.
