SUPPLEMENT NO.4 TO BRITISH APPROVED NAMES 1986

THE Ministers, that is to say the Secretary of State concerned with health in England, the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with health and with agriculture in Wales and Scotland, the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland and the Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, having on the recommendation of the Medicines Commission caused to be published a fourth supplement to British Approved Names 1986, hereby give notice under Section 102(5) of the Medicines Act 1968 that the subject-matter contained in the said supplement shall take effect on 1st December 1987.

APPLICATION has been made on 25th September 1987 under Section 51 of the Insurance Companies Act 1982 to the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry by Fountain Insurance Company Limited for approval to transfer all its rights and obligations under its policies entered into before 25th September 1987 to its holding company St. Katherine Insurance Company Public Limited Company with effect from 31st December 1987. The policies in respect of which approval is sought evidence contracts which impose on the insurer obligations the performance of which will constitute the carrying on of insurance business in the United Kingdom.

MISUSE OF DRUGS ACT 1971

SECTION 12

DIRECTION PROHIBITING EXERCISE OF  
POWERS IN RELATION TO CONTROLLED DRUGS

ARTHUR FRANCIS TAK FANG CHAN

IN accordance with Section 12(4) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State gave the following direction which came into force on 20th October 1987.

"Whereas Arthur Francis Tak Fang Chan MPS, a pharmacist within the meaning of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, whose registered address is 56 Station Approach, West Byfleet, Surrey, was on 10th April 1987 convicted of an offence under the Act.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of Section 12(2) of that Act, I hereby direct that the said Arthur Francis Tak Fang Chan can be prohibited from having in his possession, manufacturing, compounding and supplying and from supervising and controlling the manufacture, compounding and supply of any controlled drug within the meaning of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 which was on 10th April 1987 such a controlled drug save and except the following:

any preparation specified in Schedule 5 to the Misuse of Drugs Regulations 1985, other than such a preparation containing Dihydrocodeine.
