LOCH LOMOND TO CLYDEBANK CYCLE PATH
PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO TRAFFIC ORDER

THE Strathclyde Regional Council propose to amend an existing Traffic Order which prohibits all vehicles, with the exception of pedal cycles, on certain lengths of the Loch Lomond to Clydebank Cycle Path. The extent of the amendments is to extend the exemptions granted to certain classes of vehicles to include those used by lessees, as well as owners, of fishing rights on the River Leven from those lengths of path.
