CLEAN AIR ACTS, 1956 AND 1968

THE BALLINGRY SMOKE CONTROL AREA, ORDER 1990

1. NOTICE is hereby given that Dunfermline District Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section II of The Clean Air Act, 1956, propose to make an Order entitled "The Ballingry Smoke Control Area Order, 1990," declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area.
2. The Order will not come into operation until at least six months after it is made.
3. Subject to the limitations and exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of Section 11(4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of the building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine unless he proves that the smoke was not caused by use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels are:- Anthracite, including semi-anthracite, Briquetted Fuels carbonised in the process of manufacture, Coke, Electricity,
